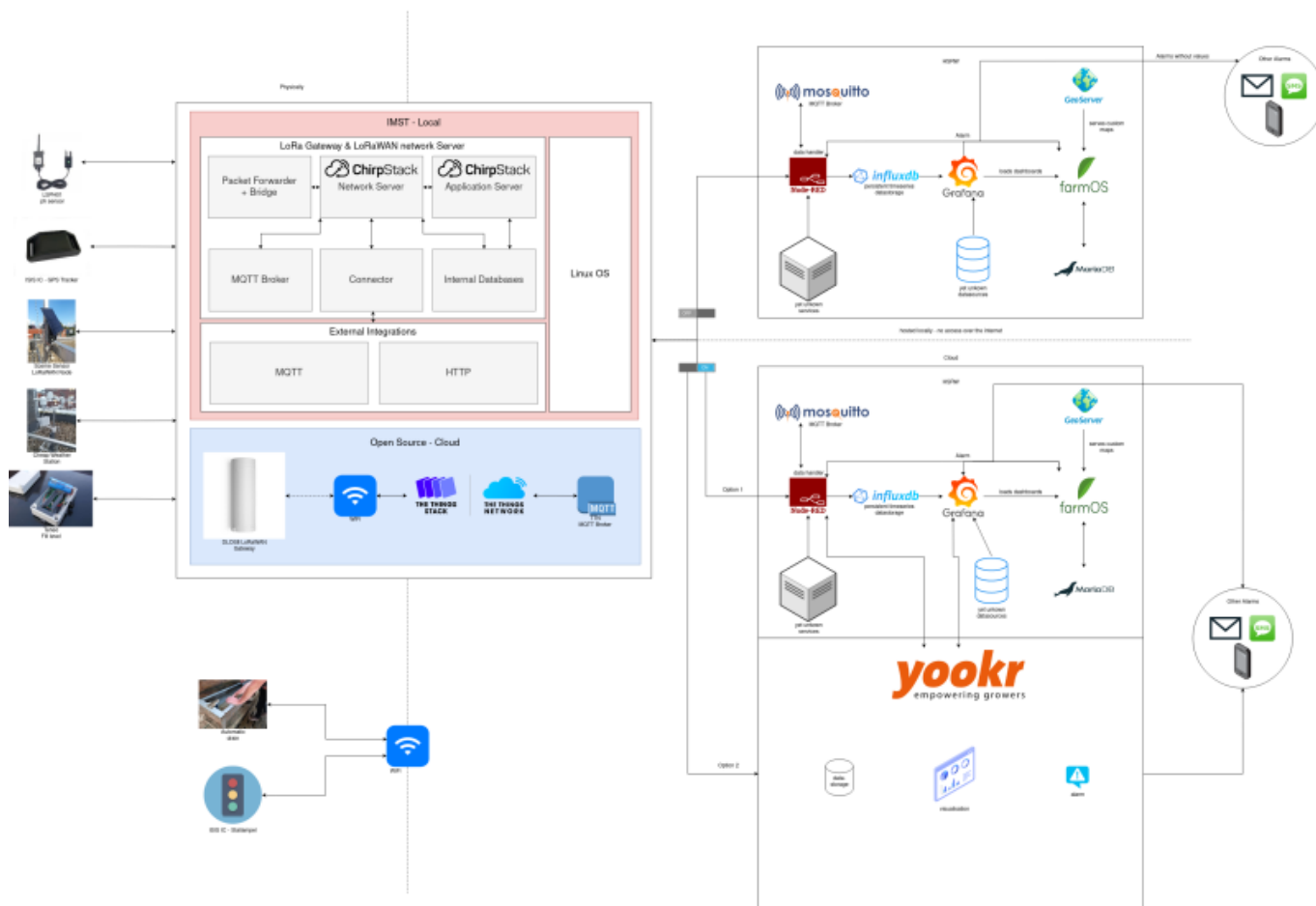


# The offline FarmOS Guide

This guide shows a complete walkthrough of installing a FarmOS instance locally on a Raspberry Pi 4 Model B. Furthermore, an instance of Node-Red, InfluxDB, and Grafana is added.
