## Recommended:

- Ryzen 7 / i7 (16 Threads+)
- 32GB RAM
- GTX 1070

Meshroom can multi-thread on some nodes but not on all. So more cores != faster! https://github.com/alicevision/meshroom/issues/175

Multiple GPUs can be used if they are older to make Meshroom run faster. Although on newer GPUs there isn't much of a difference. https://github.com/alicevision/meshroom/issues/644

In this post, it is also mentioned that it is important to have one fast SSD. GPU is not that important because it is only used while depth mapping. I personally can confirm that. A GTX 1070 ti can go through this process kinda fast. An RTX 3080 would do the job just fine. https://www.reddit.com/r/photogrammetry/comments/jr58j4/help with meshroom/
